#### **REFLECTION**

David Brooks, a columnist for the New York Times, wrote a book in 2017 called 'The Road to Character' where he traced the lives of various people, and how they were shaped by a growth towards character. In the introduction to his book, he wrote: 'Recently I've been thinking about the difference between the resume virtues and the eulogy virtues. The resume virtues are the ones you list on your resume, the skills that you bring to the job market and that contribute to your external success. The eulogy virtues are deeper. They're the virtues or values that get talked about at your funeral - whether you are kind, brave. honest or faithful; what kind of relationships you formed.' For Brooks, character is something that develops over a lifetime. Brooks believes the eulogy virtues are ultimately more significant than what we might call the C.V. virtues, and so he looks at the lives of both well-known and notso-well-known women and men to see what they might teach us about the road to character.

Brooks' book seems significant in a culture which the cultural historian Warren Susman describes as having shifted from a 'culture of character' to a 'culture of personality'. In our present context it seems that personality is regarded as more important than character. Susan Cain, writing about this phenomenon, says, 'In the culture of character, the ideal self was serious, disciplined and honourable. What counted was not so much the impression one made in public as how one behaved in private. The word personality didn't exist in English until the eighteenth century, and the idea of having 'a good personality' was not widespread until the twentieth.'

At the beginning of February we celebrate Candlemas, also known as The Presentation of Christ in the Temple. Mary and Joseph present the infant Jesus to the Lord in the Temple. The gospel reading for Candlemas

introduces us to Simeon and Anna, both of whom are people of character. Luke describes Simeon as 'righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him.' Anna is described as someone who 'worshipped' in the Temple, with 'fasting and prayer' night and day. She is a woman of great fortitude - it was no mean feat to live into old age as a widow in her culture. Both Simeon and Anna have qualities which Luke commends, and which enable them to recognize that the child Mary and Joseph present to the Lord in the Temple is the one who will bring God's salvation to Israel and all the world.

Luke describes Simeon and Anna as people of character (he says nothing about their personality!). He doesn't list their resume virtues either, rather he tells us that Simeon was a righteous man and that Anna was someone who put her hope and trust in God.

At the heart of our Christian faith is the understanding that God calls us to reflect Jesus's character in and through our lives. The road to character is not without wrong turns and yet we are called to be on the road, to follow the way Jesus makes possible. We are called to be like Simeon and Anna, to let God shape our characters so that more and more we resemble the one we follow.
