# **REFLECTION**

A few years ago, some members of my family bought us a weekend in Cologne for the Christmas markets. While we were there, two things struck me more than anything else, and they weren't related to the markets (the stuff on sale there is just the same as you can get in Manchester, without the additional cost of the air fare!). The first was that every shop, square, station, park or subway was displaying a crib – there was no hiding the fact that the forthcoming festivities were about the coming of the Christ-child. This was a religious festival, not a secular excuse to over-indulge. As a Christian, I found that wonderfully refreshing.

The second was the Shrine of the Magi in Cologne's wonderful and huge Cathedral, which incredibly survived the bombing of the second world war (many vears ago, while travelling through by train I once overheard an American tourist explaining it was a miracle because they'd built it too close to the railway!). The relics of the Three Wise Men, gifted to Cologne in the 12<sup>th</sup> century are held in a magnificent, gilded triple sarcophagus behind the High Altar. Whatever your take on shrines and relics, this is a very special and holy place which links us to the coming of these three men to see Jesus - a place to stand in awe. From the moment of their arrival and adoration of the Christchild, human history was changed. No longer was possible salvation confined to God's chosen people, the Jews, it was for everyone, no matter what their lineage. We tend to take this for granted now, but it was not always the case - we only have to read the New Testament to see the arguments the early church had about admitting gentiles (that's us!).

We wish you all a very happy, healthy and blessed New Year, but as we start the year, remember and give thanks for this huge change in God's relationship with mankind, and through it, our own access to His salvation.
