REFLECTION

I always feel sorry for our brothers and sisters in the southern hemisphere because they have Easter in the autumn. It must seem strange celebrating the feast of the Resurrection when all around nature is dying back. We are much more fortunate in our part of the world, because during these fifty days between Easter and Pentecost, all around us is growing new, displaying a constant reminder of new birth.

The thing about nature, though, is that, given a chance, it never comes back just the same as last year. My garden, which, if I'm honest, would never feature in any RHS setting, always grows new plants. Sometimes the new plants are seedlings coming off existing ones, sometimes they're gifts from the birds as they drop seeds, most frequently, of course, they're weeds brought in by the wind (but a weed is only a plant that we humans think is in the wrong place!), and sometimes I deliberately plant new seeds - the point is that nature is expands year on year.

I think all of us enjoy spring, and we Christians enjoy Eastertide as we walk with the Risen Christ in His Resurrection ministry. Equally important, though, is the next season of Ascensiontide, which starts this month. If Jesus had not ascended into heaven, there would be no church; the Risen Christ and His disciples, bound by the human necessities of time and space would have been limited in their ability to spread the Gospel. In addition, the disciples would not have wanted to leave their Master. It was the Ascension, together with the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, that freed them to take the message to the ends of the world, and to allow the church to grow far beyond the confines of Judaea and Galilee.

As we celebrate our new birth in the Risen Christ, we must recognise that we follow the original disciples in their new-found freedom to preach the Gospel, and our task is to ensure that we all play our part ensuring the Church expands just as nature does.

At these meetings church wardens and PCC members are elected, the Accounts for 2024 and the Annual Report are accepted.

In addition to the clergy of the parish, every lay person whose name is on the roll of the parish, is entitled to attend the annual meetings and take part in its proceedings.

ELECTORAL ROLL

The electoral roll is the list of names and addresses of a church's membership. Every person listed on the roll is eligible to attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) where church officers are elected.

The roll is renewed every six years and is being fully renewed this year. This will involve those over the age of 16 living in this parish and those with a worshipping connection with this church, completing fresh electoral roll forms in order to be included on the Electoral Roll. The formal notice for this was given out in church on Sunday 23 & 30 March. No new electoral roll forms can now be submitted until after the Annual Meetings on 21 May.
