REFLECTION

Praying for the Ministry of the Church

At various points through the Church Year, we pause to pray specifically for the ministry of the Church. These days are called Ember Days and we have three at the end of the month on 25, 26 & and 28 September. Ember Days give us an opportunity to give thanks for all those who serve God and their neighbour in various ways through the Church. Prayers are offered for lay and ordained leaders and there are some really good resources that the Church of England have produced for our praying. Here is a collect prayer for an Ember Day:

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified:

hear our prayer which we offer for all your faithful people,

that in their vocation and ministry they may serve you in holiness and truth to the glory of your name; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Ember days also give an opportunity to pray for people who might be exploring new ways of serving God. Maybe people looking to explore ministry as a lay leader or as an ordained minister. With this in mind, we are really looking forward to welcoming John Muyita to serve as Assistant Curate from June next year. Please be praying for him and his family as he completes his final year of training before ordination.

God has been very generous to the parishes of St. Clement's and St. Mary's in providing so many people who serve the Church in such diverse and generous ways. During this coming Embertide let us all give thanks to God for those who assist with the smooth running of our parishes.

Here are some of the areas where we can give thanks to God for those who are so generous in their service: churchwardens; PCC members; ordained and lay ministers; safeguarding leaders; those who run children's Church and other activities; musicians; fundraisers & and social events coordinators; treasurers and finance teams; group leaders, such as Mothers' Union; those who keep the church buildings and grounds safe, clean and tidy; hall bookings coordinators; flower arrangers; those who give their time so generously in ways that often go unnoticed; those who make generous financial

contributions to the Church's ministry; those who have administration roles; the list goes on...

All these areas are vital to the ministry of the Church – let us pray for those who fulfil these roles and give thanks to God for them. We can also pray that God will continue to call people into the places where he would like them to serve.

It's also worth remembering that a lot of our ministry falls outside the specific aspects of what we might call Church life. Many people's ministry is specifically in their workplace, at home with family, or looking after loved ones with whom they are connected. The Church's ministry extends to wherever people serve in love and the Spirit of Jesus. We are all ministers and God's kingdom comes wherever his people serve him with generosity and grace. Let us pray this coming Embertide that people will continue to respond to God's call to serve the world though the ministry of the Church.
